

Left Twix - Right Twix

The Twix candy bar commercials make me laugh. You have candy bars that look the same and taste the same. But there is this a difference: one is a left Twix and the other is a right Twix. If you think the difference doesn't matter, think of your left hands and right hands. They look the same, but not quite. They are not interchangeable. Just try putting your left hand into a right-hand glove and you'll see how true it is. Mittens, maybe; gloves, absolutely not.

There's an important life lesson here about the choices we make. Sometimes we only think about the choice between good and evil. Now this is a good starting point. In fact, it is the first principle of human life: do good and reject evil. But when we look at what is good, sometimes it's not just one thing. Think back to the garden of Eden. God has made an



abundance of different good things: all kinds of plants, trees, fish, birds and other creatures. And once they're made by God, they have this beautiful ability to be fruitful and multiply. Good things can grow! This includes the good of our humanity. God didn't just make men or women. He made them both: male and female. They, too, were to be fruitful and multiply. God wasn't encouraging Adam and Eve to do math. They have multiplied up to the billions of their offspring that live on our planet today.

In the midst of this abundance of good, God gave man and woman the freedom to choose. "You are free to eat from any of the trees of the garden except the tree of knowledge of good and evil. From that tree you shall not eat; when you eat from it you shall die." There was no need to taste sin, that forbidden fruit of evil and good. No, they had many other good things to choose from. And that freedom remains with us today. Once we've rejected evil, we have the freedom to choose among many good things in this world.

You can have pancakes or oatmeal for breakfast. You can study many things and learn a job that suits your talents. Or you can stretch yourself outside your comfort zone and work at something completely foreign to you. You can choose a job not quite according to your tastes for the good of your family. You can be married or be single. If you choose to be married, it could be from a number of people among the group of the other biological sex. Of course, you will have to choose a person who will also freely choose you. You can choose where to live and what your house will look like. And if someone is homeless, you can choose to help them, in multiple different ways. And if your house is filled with different people, you will somehow have to navigate all those different choices. Have you tried to order a pizza in a large group? Not an easy job. In all those things, it's important to keep in mind that most of those choices are just different. Except anchovies—they are evil.

If we see these types of choices in our homes, then we should expect to find them in our church home we call our parish. The temperature can't always be at my personal comfort level. Different people like different decorations. The music can't always be my personal favorite songs. Different pastors and different priests things differently. So do different parishioners. The other options aren't evil, just different. Things might be different even at other parishes in the diocese. So thanks for your patience with me as I happily serve you here: a different pastor for you at a different parish to me.

Here are two things I hope will help with the Left Twix - Right Twix lesson. The first should help us personally: Do you find yourself sometimes agonizing about the choices you make? Check if you are choosing between two good, but just different, things. If so, realize that God gave you your freedom and trusts you to use it. Simply go forward in love for him. You can later test the fruit your choice bears. Most of our daily decisions are not lifelong decisions, so we can rest in our overall desire to serve God in all things as best we can.

The second thing helps when our choices intersect with the choices of those around us. Sometimes we have to yield our personal preferences for the good of the whole. Oftentimes, others have done this for us. If we never went against our preferences, we might be avoiding the cross of Jesus in our daily lives. Heck, we'd never order a pizza and then everybody would go hungry. But when we do consider others along with ourselves, then we can share a meal together with great joy.

Now think about the greatest meal, the sacred and sacrificial banquet we call the Holy Eucharist. When we meet for Mass, there are so many of us who are so different and we all act differently in many ways. But in God's eyes, we are all good, very good. Let's be grateful that among our parish family, Jesus loves to come and feed us with his Body and Blood.

OUR TIME WITH FR. ALBINO, CONTINUED...

RECONCILIATION

During his time with us, Fr. Albino was available to hear Reconciliation every Sunday before Mass. Most of the Sudanese attending Mass are now able to regularly receive the Holy Eucharist.

BAPTISMS

Parents and Godparents received formation in their native Arabic language for the first time in the history of the Sudanese Community at St. Petronille Fr. Albino held Baptism classes for parents for six weeks every Thursday and Sunday, and on Easter Sunday he baptized twelve children and one adult. Parents and families traveled from five different states to have Fr. Albino baptize their children.

CONFIRMATION

On March 31, Gaska Abella received the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. She told the community that she had waited seven years for a Sudanese Catholic priest. She said, "Now, I am sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit." Gaska added that she has a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and she asked the Heavenly Father to give the Holy Spirit to our parish and especially to the Sundanese Community, in loving service.

HOLY MATRIMONY AND BLESSING OF MARRIAGES

Father Albino offered Pre-Cana instruction to engaged couples twice weekly for a month to prepare them for the Sacrament of Marriage, and he spoke to the community of men and women about building their life together on a foundation of love and respect, leadership at home for men, participation in work, and raising their children together according to the Catholic faith. Fr. Albino officiated his first wedding on Easter Sunday. This was a powerful experience for many couples and families to witness and it opened the doors for other couples to also receive a special blessing over their marriages. Presently we have three-plus families seeking a marriage blessing and preparing to take that step.


We have the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the Church every Friday from 3 -10pm, 24-hour Adoration on First Fridays following the 8am Mass
